#### **FIRST LESSON**

Isaiah 53:10-12

Yet it was the LORD's will to crush him and to allow him to suffer. Because you made his life a guilt offering, he will see offspring. He will prolong his days, and the LORD's gracious plan will succeed in his hand. <sup>11</sup> After his soul experiences anguish, he will see the light of life. He will provide satisfaction. Through their knowledge of him, my just servant will justify the many, for he himself carried their guilt. <sup>12</sup> Therefore I will give him an allotment among the great, and with the strong he will share plunder, because he poured out his life to death, and he let himself be counted with rebellious sinners. He himself carried the sin of many, and he intercedes for the rebels.

#### SECOND LESSON

1 Corinthians 9:7-12,19-23

<sup>7</sup>What soldier ever serves at his own expense? Who plants a vineyard and does not eat some of its fruit? Or who takes care of a flock and does not drink milk from the flock? <sup>8</sup> Am I saying this just from a human point of view? Doesn't the law also say this? <sup>9</sup>Yes, it is written in the Law of Moses, "You shall not muzzle an ox while it is treading out grain." Is God really concerned about oxen, <sup>10</sup> or does he say this entirely for our sake? Yes, it was written for our sake, because the plowman ought to plow in hope, and the thresher ought to thresh in hope of getting a share.<sup>11</sup> If we sowed spiritual seed for your good, is it too much if we reap material benefits from you? <sup>12</sup> If others have some right to make this claim on you, don't we even more? But we did not use this right. Instead, we endure everything so as not to cause any hindrance for the gospel of Christ. . In fact, although I am free from all, I enslaved myself to all so that I might gain many more.<sup>20</sup> To the Jews, I became like a Jew so that I might gain Jews. To those who are under the law, I became like a person under the law (though I myself am not under the law) so that I might gain those who are under the law.<sup>21</sup> To those who are without the law, I became like a person without the law (though I am not without God's law but am within the law of Christ) so that I might gain those who are without the law. <sup>22</sup> To the weak, I became weak so that I might gain the weak. I have become all things to all people so that I may save at least some. <sup>23</sup> And I do everything for the sake of the gospel so that I may share in it along with others.

### **GOSPEL LESSON**

<sup>32</sup> They were on the road, going up to Jerusalem, and Jesus was leading them. The disciples were amazed, and the others who followed were afraid. He took the Twelve aside again and began to tell them what was going to happen to him.<sup>33</sup> "Look, we are going up to Jerusalem, and the Son of Man will be betrayed to the chief priests and the experts in the law. They will condemn him to death and will hand him over to the Gentiles. <sup>34</sup> They will mock him, spit on him, flog him, and kill him. On the third day he will rise again." <sup>35</sup> James and John, the sons of Zebedee, approached him and said, "Teacher, we wish that you would do for us whatever we ask." <sup>36</sup> He said to them, "What do you want me to do for you?" <sup>37</sup> They said to him, "Promise that we may sit, one at your right and one at your left, in your glory." <sup>38</sup> But Jesus said to them, "You do not know what you are asking. Can you drink the cup that I am going to drink or be baptized with the baptism that I am going to be baptized with?" <sup>39</sup> "We can," they replied. Jesus told them, "You will drink the cup that I am going to drink and be baptized with the baptism that I am going to be baptized with. <sup>40</sup> But to sit at my right or at my left is not for me to give; rather, these places belong to those for whom they have been prepared." <sup>41</sup> When the ten heard this, they were angry with James and John. <sup>42</sup> Jesus called them together and said, "You know that those who are considered rulers over the Gentiles lord it over them, and their great ones exercise authority over them. <sup>43</sup> But that is not the way it is to be among you. Instead, whoever wants to be great among you will be your servant, <sup>44</sup> and whoever wants to be first among you will be a slave of all.<sup>45</sup> For even the Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many."

### **CONFESSION OF FAITH**

Luther's Explanation of the Second Article of the Apostles' Creed from the Small Catechism

C: I believe that Jesus Christ, true God, begotten of the Father from eternity, and also true man, born of the Virgin Mary, is my Lord. He has redeemed me, a lost and condemned creature, purchased and won me from all sins, from death and from the power of the devil, not with gold or silver, but with his holy, precious blood and with his innocent suffering and death. All this he did that I should be his own, and live under him in his kingdom, and serve him in everlasting righteousness, innocence and blessedness, just as he has risen from death and lives and rules eternally. This is most certainly true.


