## Did you know?

That Pilgrim Lutheran Church has a Planned Giving Committee just for that purpose? This committee was formed back in 2014 under the leadership of our own Ron Meier. A fund called the Pilgrim Trust and Endowment Fund was established with 4 specialized sub-funds: The Building Sub-Fund, The Pilgrim Sub-Fund, The Mission Sub-Fund and the Tuition Assistance Sub-Fund. Each sub-fund benefits a specific ministry of Pilgrim. Gifts can come from cash, stocks, bonds, mutual funds, retirement plans, insurance policies, real estate, etc. Each fund becomes “active” when the balance reaches \$10,000. To date, the Building Fund is active with a balance of over \$50,000 and the Tuition Assistance Fund is active with a balance of over \$14,000.

We thankfully respond to God’s grace by planning our regular weekly offerings. We also honor the Lord by sharing our gifts to support these funds through additional gifts during our lifetime, as well as honoring Him when planning the transition of our earthly blessings and wealth at life’s end through our estate planning. Consider leaving a “lasting legacy” for future generations, passing on your faith and love for Christ and supporting the Lord’s work beyond your lifetime.

For more information there is a display rack on the table in the narthex with brochures, gift forms and gift envelopes. You may also speak to any current member of the committee: Bryan Giesenschlag, David Loomis, Christine Steeno, or one of our Pastors. Completed gifts and forms can be placed into Mailbox #48, given to any committee member or to one of our pastors.

Pilgrim members also have access to the complimentary, confidential services of WELS Christian giving counselors who can help with Christian estate planning.

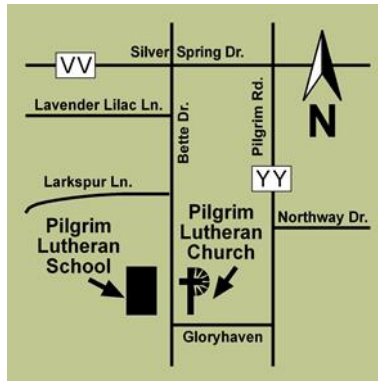
